Plans are underway for an official Start on Site ceremony during Rural Housing Week (Monday 11th – Friday 15th July) at the first Passivhaus scheme in the county! This ground-breaking scheme in Wootton Wawen is being designed and built to the rigorous Passivhaus standard which aims to dramatically reduce a building's ecological footprint by ensuring that ultra-low levels of energy are required for space heating and cooling.

New developments in the pipeline

Our busy year of new development has got off to a good start with plans well underway to develop 37 much needed affordable homes to villages across the county by 2018.

WOOTTON WAWEN

Planning permission has been secured for our exciting Passivhaus development of 12 properties for affordable rent and two for shared ownership in Wootton Wawen, and work will start on site in September.

LONG COMPTON

A planning application has been submitted for a development of five homes for affordable rent, along with four for Local Market sale, and a decision is expected this month. HCA and Stratford District Council funding is in place.

BROOM

A planning application has been submitted for a development of five properties for affordable rent and one for shared ownership. HCA and Stratford District Council funding is in place.

GREAT ALNE

HCA funding is in place for development of seven properties for affordable rent. A planning application will be submitted in June.

STRETTON ON FOSSE

Full planning permission has been granted for five properties for affordable rent and the land is in the developer's ownership. The properties will be funded through the developer's S106 affordable homes obligation.

Universal Credit roll-out

Residents are being regularly updated on the roll-out of Universal Credit and a special Pocket Guide has been produced. The at-a-glance guide has been sent to every resident to explain everything they need to know about how Universal Credit will work and what they need to do to make a claim.
