## The Story

The development has helped a village dream for the county's first community pub, to become a reality. It has enabled local people to continue living in Norton Lindsey, helping to sustain the rural community. When the village pub was threatened, villagers launched a campaign to run it as a community concern.

The New Inn opened its doors to its first customers in April 2017 and plans are underway to create a community hub for local groups, a village shop and parcel pickup point.
